Curriculum Policy

Based on a deep understanding of persons as comprehensive being and their health requirements, nurses must develop practical skills to fulfill their roles in their community and support people of various health levels to grow and live comfortably. Distinctive features of our department are the cultivation of professional abilities that enable nurses to independently and successfully work in the community, as well as the development of social, medical, and welfare services. For this reason, we have created a curriculum based on three objectives. First, the curriculum should cover the general foundation of Nursing Arts and Sciences for nurses, public health nurses, and midwives, and also emphasize the development of practical nursing competency that can be used to focus on health and support "people's lives and cultures". Second, the curriculum should emphasize life-long education and career development as a nurse, public health nurse, or midwife as well as the continuation and development of practical nursing competency after graduation. Lastly, our curriculum includes that of school nurses, such as health education and management, so that students can play an active role in these fields as well.

Diploma Policy

A bachelor's degree (Nursing Sciences) will be awarded to those who have inculcated the competencies listed below and have obtained the necessary credits from the set curriculum of this department.

- 1. To fulfill the mission, roles, and responsibilities of an independent nursing professional by practicing nursing in a way that respects life and human dignity and protects fundamental human rights.
- 2. To possess scientific evidence-based expert knowledge and skills for promoting and restoring human health, preventing disease, and alleviating pain.
- 3. To develop a deep understanding of disease- and injury-related suffering by supporting the sick from daily-life perception, and to nurture people within communities, including groups, areas, and society.
- 4. To develop scientific thinking, ethics, internationality, as well as grow and evolve by serving people living in diverse societies and hailing from different cultures.
- 5. To have the power to manage yourself, engage with others, and interact with the society through dialogue with yourself, others, and the community.
- 6. To acquire a moral attitude through the nursing practicum by understanding ethical principles, the processes by which ethical judgments are rendered, and methods for thinking about ethics .
- 7. To explore the latest skills and knowledge by playing a key role in the society and learning from oneself.
- 8. To collaboratively and unitedly work with others for pursuing a common goal of promoting health and welfare.

Curriculum

School-wide common courses including liberal arts and specialized courses are available to provide a rich education and the deep knowledge needed to expand the potential of students as women, so that they may have the judgment and practical competencies — to fulfill their responsibility in various community settings, where they can independently provide professional nursing care in health care and welfare institutions.

We offer 'Seminar of Active Learning' for students from their first year to their fourth year based on a community-of-practice mentality so that students may acquire the skills to develop for a community, the expressive skills to communicate with others, and the practical competencies of nursing that this Department aims to nurture in our students and that are given in our Educational Goals.
